Receiving these items is disruptive to both the office and the classroom. Please ensure that your child's bag is packed correctly with all they may need for the day, including those things needed for extra murals and/or aftercare.
- Thank you to Mr Abrahams and Mr Daliath, two of our school parents, for helping to supervise our learners in the morning before school. We appreciate your efforts in helping to keep our learners safe.
- A quarterly colour newsletter will be released on our website at the end of each term. The first one will be available for download on Friday 15 March 2019.
- TKPS will celebrate World Book Day on 12 April 2019. Learners are requested to please come dressed as their favourite book character. The normal civvies-day fee will apply.

FINANCE

• There has been a delay in school statements being sent out. The reason for this is twofold: 1) the Finance Department updated their software at the beginning of the year and learners' and parents'

personal details had to be recaptured in the process; and 2) Mrs Goff, Head of Finance, was tasked with a significant amount of extra administrative work from the WCED this quarter. This matter is being tended to with great urgency. We sincerely apologise for any inconvenience this may have caused.

- With regard to statements, **going forward each child will be billed separately**. This makes statements easier to read and payments easier to track.
- Please note that **your child's account number may have changed from last year**. The account number is located on the top right hand corner of the statement.
- When making payment, your payment reference should include the account number allocated to your child AND what the payment is for, i.e., school fees, clothing, aftercare etc. The account number is listed on the top right hand corner of the statement.
- Regarding outstanding debt, we would like to thank those parents who have paid or are in the
 process of paying off their debt we appreciate your cooperation. To those parents who have again
 neglected to pay their outstanding debt, your account will be handed over to a collecting agency
 during the course of the second term. Please note that this may negatively affect your credit record.
- Regarding debit orders, a reminder that these need to be updated at the beginning of each school
 year to reflect the correct school fees. Please contact the Finance Department if you need to update
 your debit order information.
- Exemption applications have been captured and will be submitted to the SGB Chairperson and Treasurer for consideration. If you applied for an exemption, you will be required to attend a meeting during the course of the second term. Applications will be finalised in April 2019.
- Our new SGB are in the process of implementing stricter measures to ensure the payment of school fees. Any accounts that are in arrears will be addressed by the SGB each school term. Please keep your account up to date.

FUNDRAISING

- Our learners **collected coins** as part of our term one fundraiser. Apart from raising money for the school, the learners used the coins to learn about money and to create and solve various math problems. We'd like to thank Miss Gordon for arranging this fundraiser.
