GENERAL NEWS

- Official end-of-year exams are scheduled to commence on 20 November for our Grade 7 learners and on 22
 November for our Grade 4 6 learners. You will soon receive an official timetable from your child's class
 teacher, outlining the exam dates and subjects. We kindly urge parents and guardians to provide unwavering
 support to our learners during this challenging period, as exams can be quite stressful for some.
- Please note that school will close at 1pm from Monday 20 November 2023 (regular times on a Friday) until
 the end of the year to allow learners time to sufficiently prepare for the upcoming examinations. For our Grade
 R learners, the school will operate on its regular schedule; and after care will also operate per normal. Please
 make sure that you make the necessary transport arrangements to ensure that all learners are collected on
 time. For Grades 1 7, the closing times will be as follows:

This decision aims to assist families during these challenging economic times by reducing the need for frequent washing or the purchase of additional uniform items. We believe this adjustment will be of great help to parents and guardians, ensuring that the cost of living crisis does not hinder our learners' education. In addition, we would like to remind everyone that, according to our uniform policy, takkies (sneakers) may only be worn on intra-mural and physical education days. On all other school days, prescribed school shoes should be worn. We kindly request that takkies be either white or black in colour to maintain uniformity and uphold our school's professional appearance. Your cooperation and adherence to these uniform guidelines is highly appreciated.
- We are thrilled to share the latest news about our building project. We have successfully secured "concept approval" for our proposed project from the Education MEC, which is an encouraging development following the green light we received from the WCED. Currently, our focus is on securing approvals from the Department of Infrastructure and the City of Cape Town. These approvals are pivotal steps before we can kick-start this exciting project, which includes the construction of two classrooms, purposefully designed to support our coding and robotics initiatives, alongside an art room and an aftercare facility.
