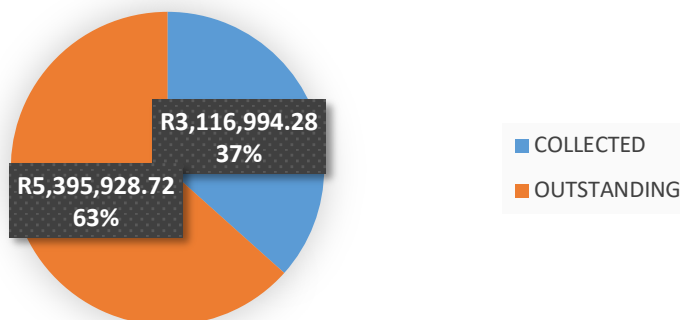
ACADEMICS

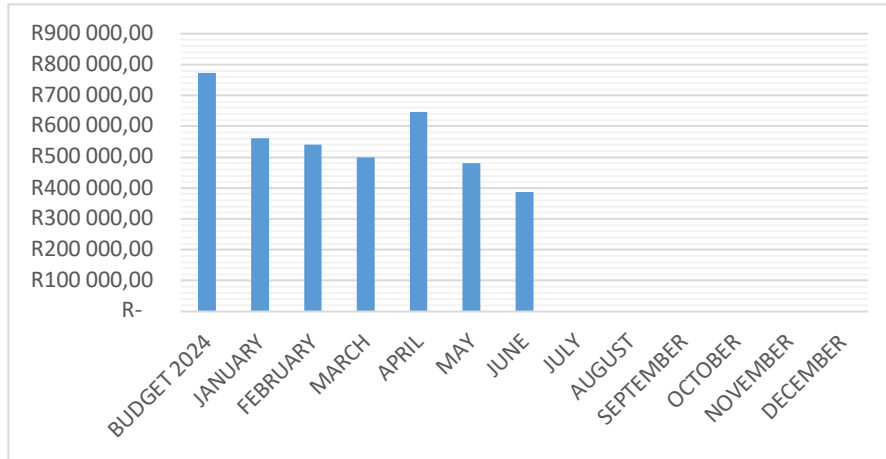
